The heat of July did not stop all of you hearty runners and walkers out there. We had a few races turned in that had quite a few of our club members at. Here is a recap of just a few of them.

Whiskey Rebellion 5K

There were almost 700 runners and walkers at the annual Canonsburg event this year. A little cooler than last year, so there were some pretty good times.

Nick Wolk from Peters TWP and Pitt took top honors in 15:38 with Travis Meyers-Arrigoni close behind in 15:51. Our top female finisher and second overall was Emily Sagun, who crossed the mat in 20:37. And our top male finisher was Rich Sandala, who came through in 21:38. In the walk category Kelley Murdock was first overall in 33:45, and Gary Bennett was our first male finisher and second overall in 26:23.

Rain Day 5K

The 41st annual event did not have any rain associated with it, and the weather kept cool for most of the run. 120 runners and walkers crossed the finish line this year.

Logan Maust was the overall winner in a nice time of 16:55 and Kristen McMichael was the first female in 19:08. Bob Pikelis was our first male finisher in 22:15 and LuAnne McCullough was our first female finisher at 32:07. In the walker category Kelley Murdock was once again the first overall finisher, coming through in 33:50, and Rick Respole was the first overall male finisher in 38:46.


